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William Grant & Sons Acquires Tuthilltown Spirits in New York State

William Grant & Sons of Scotland has acquired Tuthilltown Spirits, New York State's first distillery since Prohibition. William Grant & Sons acquired Tuthilltown's Hudson Whiskey brand in 2010.



Based in the Hudson Valley north of New York City, William Grant & Sons has acquired the entire 36-acre Tuthilltown facility, which includes the distillery that produces Hudson Whiskey and a variety of other local craft spirits brands, the gourmet restaurant, visitor center and scenic grounds with riverfront views.

Known for its 130-year history of Scotch whisky distilling, this acquisition will expand the William Grant & Sons reach into craft American whiskey distilling for the first time.
